4. Report from the Ad-Hoc Committee on Faculty Council's Purpose

The chair introduced the by-law revisions, as well as the ad hoc committee's work on revising them and their consulting of colleagues over the last few months. 5. Discussion on Police Presence at Campus Events

D. Thomas outlined a situation that arose during a guest lecture that he had organized on campus where plainclothes police made an appearance and attempted to intimidate his guest speaker. He raised concerns about academic freedom, police surveillance, and the willingness in the future of guest speakers to contribute to events and asked how we can make the campus safe for everyone, including activists. Members present voiced concern on a number of issues, including whether the university has policies about police presence. A rich discussion ensued.
