A PERSONAL TOUCH THE PRINTING OF THE UNIVERSITY DIPLOMAS



For more than three decades, Fine Arts research professor and visual artist Thaddeus Holownia has been printing Mount Allison University's diplomas using the letterpress process at the Anchorage Press in Jolicure, NB. The tradition of hand printing Mount Allison's diplomas dates back to the early 1900s.

Each of the names of Mount Allison's graduates is hand cast and printed with an embossed method on the diplomas. It is a printing process that Holownia says makes for a spectacular finished product. Each spring he spends considerable time casting all the names of the graduates before printing the diplomas for Convocation.

For research, Holownia visited the archives to look at old diplomas and certificates.

"The two colours of ink and the scale contribute to the special presence the Mount Allison diploma has on the wall," he says. "Each one has a real relationship to the history of degree granting at Mount Allison University."



ROBERT M. OGILVIE ('67)

Business leader and philanthropist

Robert M. Ogilvie is one of Canada's most successful business leaders — most notably in his leadership of Toromont Industries, which provides specialized equipment to a broad array of essential industries, including construction, power generation, forestry, and agriculture, and environmentally advanced refrigeration systems used in the food, dairy, cold storage, and beverage industries as well as for indoor and outdoor ice surfaces.

Under his leadership, Toromont has grown to employ more than 6,000 skilled workers at more than 150 locations across Canada.

A former member of Mount Allison's Board of Regents, his leadership is marked by business growth and a commitment to corporate social responsibility. Toromont makes direct philanthropic contributions to a number of organizations, particularly those dedicated to health care and children, while employees are encouraged to give back not only at work, but in their local communities.

Ogilvie's personal philanthropy is rooted in the family's foundation, the Airlie Foundation, which supports projects related to education, health and medicine, environment, youth at risk, and advocacy for the marginalized.

ANNETTE VERSCHUREN ('78)

Chair and CEO of NRStor Inc. and former President of Home Depot Canada

Annette Verschuren is Chair and CEO of NRStor Inc., a company that develops, builds, and operates energy storage projects. From 1996 to 2011, Ms. Verschuren was President of The Home Depot Canada, where she oversaw the company's growth from 19 to 179 Canadian stores. She is also the co-founder of the craft chain Michaels Canada.

Ms. Verschuren is on the boards of Air Canada, Canadian Natural Resources Limited, Liberty Mutual Insurance Group, and Saputo Inc. Additionally, she is Chair of MaRS Discovery District and is Chair of Sustainable Development Technology Canada. She is the author of *Bet on Me*, in which she shares her approach to transformational leadership.

Ms. Verschuren is an Officer of the Order of Canada and is a Companion of the Canadian Business Hall of Fame. She serves as co-chair of Smart Prosperity and has 10 honorary doctorates.

DR. BONNIE HENRY ('86)

Provincial Health Officer for British Columbia

The first woman appointed Provincial Health Officer for the Province of British Columbia, Dr. Bonnie Henry (Mount Allison Class of 1986) is a public health and preventive medicine expert who has led one of Canada's largest provinces through the COVID-19 pandemic with her mantra "Be Kind, Be Calm, Be Safe."

As a medical advisor and specialist in infectious diseases both in Canada and abroad, Dr. Henry has worked with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) on the Polio Eradication program in Pakistan in 2000, the World Health Organization (WHO) to control the Ebola outbreak in Uganda in 2001, and served as the Associate Medical Officer of Health for Toronto Public Health on the 2003 SARS outbreak in Toronto.

She also served in the Canadian military and was part of the Infection Control Expert Group and the Canadian Pandemic Co-ordinating Committee responding to pandemic H1N1 (2009) influenza.

She is the author of *Soap and Water and Common Sense*, a guide to staying healthy in a microbe-filled world, and *Be Kind*, *Be Calm*, *Be Safe: Four Weeks that Shaped a Pandemic*.

DR. LISA DAWN HAMILTON

Associate Professor and Department Head of Psychology

Dr. Lisa Dawn Hamilton has taught at Mount Allison since 2010. Her research areas include behavioural neuroscience and social/personality psychology, with a focus on human sexuality and stress. She also runs the MASH (Mount Allison Sexual Health) research lab.

Hamilton works to make her teaching and subject matter accessible to her students in several ways, including a seminar class where students researched and produced a podcast series around stress, burnout, and resilience in 2020.

Her teaching and research programs extend well beyond Mount Allison's labs and classrooms. In 2019 she established SexEdEast, offering educational programming and workshops to the community around sex education and sexual health. She is also the creator of the podcast — *Do We Know Things*, examining themes in sexual health and education.

Hamilton is a member of the University's Senate and, in 2020, served as co-chair of Mount Allison's Sexual Violence Prevention Working Group. She continues to serve on the University's Advisory Committee on Sexual Violence Prevention.

The Herbert and Leota Tucker Teaching Award is Mount Allison's highest recognition of teaching excellence and Mount Allison's only university-wide teaching award. Established by Edmund, Harold, and William Tucker in memory of their parents, it is intended to encourage excellence in teaching at Mount Allison University by acknowledging those who exemplify this excellence.



IN MEMORY DR. STEPHEN (STEVE) WESTCOTT

Our community suffered a great loss this year with the passing of beloved chemistry professor Dr. Steve Westcott.

Steve was an integral part of the Mount Allison community for many years, teaching and mentoring thousands of students during his career. He taught at Mount Allison since 1995 and was a recipient of the Paul Paré Medal and multiple Excellence Awards. A long-time Canada Research Chair holder (more than 20 years), he was a leader in his field and inspired many Mount Allison chemistry students to pursue careers in research.

His research group, the Wild Toads, was one of the largest on campus, even welcoming high school students and community members to learn more about the world of chemistry. He was known to many as an amazing teacher, a brilliant researcher, and a kind colleague and friend.

Dr. Andrew Grant, Associate Professor Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry In 2020, he shifted his research focus to COVID-19 treatment and recovery with the project, The fifth element: Battle COVID-19. Under his leadership, the Westcott research team, including many Mount Allison students and international collaborators, contributed significantly to the field of chemistry, studying the health effects of new compounds based on natural products such as capsaicin (the chemical that makes hot peppers hot), eugenol, and boron.

Steve will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

MICHAEL DE ADDER ('91)

Award-winning editorial cartoonist

Michael de Adder is an award-winning editorial cartoonist who joined *The Washington Post* as its political cartoonist in 2021.

He has worked for several publications over the course of his career, freelancing for the *Halifax Chronicle Herald*, the *Toronto Star*, *The Hill Times*, and *The Record*, Mount Allison's alumni magazine. His work has been featured on major news outlets including *CNN*, *NBC*, *Counterpoint*, and *The Lincoln Project*.

Nominated for six National Newspaper Awards, de Adder was named the winner of the 2020 Herblock Prize for editorial cartooning, received the Association of American Editorial Cartoonist's Golden Spike Award, and was shortlisted for the Reuben.

De Adder has also published several books including *dePictions*; You Might Be From Canada If...; as well as a series of these books for all Atlantic Canadian provinces.

CHIEF TERRANCE (TERRY) PAUL

Chief and CEO of Membertou First Nation, Membertou, NS

Terrance (Terry) Paul, OC, is the Chief and CEO of Membertou First Nation, a position he has held since 1984. He is credited with guiding and building one of the most respected Indigenous communities in Canada.

A survivor of Canada's Residential School System, Paul credits his culture and language for enabling him to rise above and to move forward. He started a career in community development in Boston as a young man, eventually returning home to Membertou, being elected Chief in 1984

Paul holds leadership positions with many organizations and boards including the National Aboriginal Capital Corporations Association, the First Nation Financial Authority Board, Nova Scotia's Economic Growth Council, the Ulnooweg Development Group Inc., the Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey, National Indigenous Economic Development Board, and Cape Breton University's Shannon School of Business. He was recently named an *Atlantic Business Magazine* Top 50 CEO.

Under Chief Paul's leadership, the land base of Membertou has tripled and the community employment rate has risen to over 80 per cent. With a focus on education, Membertou's graduation rates have risen to more than 90 per cent.

In 2020, Paul, representing the Mi'kmaq Coalition, and partnered with Premium Brand Holdings Corporation, undertook the single largest investment made by an Indigenous group in Canada.

DR. JENNIFER RUSSELL

Chief Medical Officer of Health for New Brunswick

Dr. Jennifer Russell is the Chief Medical Officer of Health for New Brunswick, leading the province's COVID-19 pandemic response.

Russell worked as a physician with the Canadian Armed Forces for 10 years, both in Canada and internationally, and with Veterans Affairs Canada. She joined New Brunswick's Public Health Department in 2014, serving as Deputy Chief Medical Officer of Health and being appointed as Chief Medical Officer of Health in 2015.

In this role, she has worked to promote and advocate for the care and well-being of all New Brunswickers, in particular family physicians, implementing various work-life balance and mental health initiatives. She also helped lead provincial measures during a regional measles outbreak in 2019.

Russell is a member of the Council of Chief Medical Officers of Health (CCMOH) and the Pan-Canadian Public Health Network Council (PHNC), contributing valuable input to Canada's national health strategy.

In addition to her medical credentials, Russell is a trained and accomplished musician who has released two swing albums, *Double Kiss*, released in 2014, and *Triple Step* in 2019.

PIERRE LASSONDE

Business leader and one of Canada's most notable patrons of the arts

As a business leader, he is perhaps most noted for his innovations in the financing of gold mining exploration, principally through both incarnations of Franco-Nevada Corporation.

His giving stretches from his two *alma maters*, Polytechnique Montréal and the University of Utah, to York University, the University of Toronto, and Mount Allison University, where the Pierre Lassonde School of Fine Arts was established in 2021. The Musée National des Beaux-arts du Québec is home to The Pierre Lassonde Pavilion, dedicated entirely to Canadian art. Lassonde maintains his connection to Polytechnique Montréal where he is now Chair of the Board.

Dr. Karl Hele, a member of the Garden River First Nation of the Anishinaabeg in Ontario, joined Mount Allison in 2018. His research areas include Indigenous history, law, and politics.

Since arriving at Mount Allison, he has played a leadership role in program development around the new Indigenous Studies minor and certificate options, introducing new courses on topics such as Indigenous history, cross border encounters, and the Indian Act Hele is a historian by trade, whose studies focus on his home community, specifically the missionary encounter. In addition to his teaching and research programs, Hele also serves on the University's Indigenous Advisory Circle, working with students, faculty, staff, and First Nations communities on Mount Allison's path towards reconciliation and decolonization.

The pre-eminent faculty award at Mount Allison, the Paul Paré Medal is awarded annually to a professor who has best demonstrated outstanding teaching; outstanding research, scholarship, and/or creative activities; and an exemplary record of service.
