Creator's Note



It is difficult to locate the centre of a poem. It arises from the poet's words but is animated through the reader's eyes and the speaker's breath. The poem's meaning transforms with each encounter. Likewise, this project began as a seed but has proliferated (as a patch of loosestrife might) through many leading hands, travelling in many directions. The creation of this new work has been, above all, a collaboration. Thank you to all who have generously given their energy and trust as we imagined something new together.

Tonight's performance will take place in two parts. The first will be a procession through Waterfowl Park where we invite you to turn your ear to the landscape and hear it speak. The second part will take place in Normandy Field, where the Elliott Chorale will perform an original composition by Hope Salmonson, accompanied by our courageous team of puppeteers. If you joined us for our lantern building workshops, or have a lantern of your own design, you are welcome to share your light throughout the experience.

She pressed her ear to the ice and it spoke.


A neighbour saw,
