Director's Note

« Only poetry is certain in a time of cataclysms. » - Roger Vitrac.

Like UBU '24, VICTOR '25 is a provocation. What does an upscale family feel when they watch, in 2025, scenes from an outrageous surrealist play about a precocious, badass child who does not want to live in his parents' hypocritical world? Victor caused a riot when he first appeared in 1928, fell silent for a generation, then became a poster child for student protesters in the sixties. He still emerges in far-flung places – Greece, Hungary, Sackville – to remind us that our society robs children of their childhood.

We hope you enjoy the parental disarray when they encounter Victor; the fascination of their child who discovers a troubling kindred spirit; the bemusement of their laid-back cat; the delight of Tintamarlequins who bring us characters from Victor's upside-down world; and the breakdown of an algorithmic host who ushers us into a StarGazer home-theatre transactional world where everything, including Victor, is available for a price. It's 2025, our Victor has a happy ending, and here's to re-discovering some of the playfulness and joy we suspect we might have lost. Vive le théâtre! - AF
