 A total of 1,414 alumni attended events this fiscal year, surpassing the goal of 1,000 by over 40%

- 2023 Results:
  - Hosted 6 Sociables with overwhelming demand and positive feedback.
- 2024 Updates:
  - Expanded to **10 events**, supported by a sponsorship.

### • 2025 Plans:

- Increase Sociables to **11 events** with new locations by end of Q2.
- **Five events already scheduled** for the upcoming fiscal year, laying the groundwork for further growth.

- Create a process for annual review of endowed funds to ensure adherence to the original creators' wishes.
- Develop a process for reviewing and approving proposed amendments to fund terms of reference (e.g., due to program discontinuation).

# 4. Future Growth:

- Expectation for additional funds to come under the committee's stewardship.
- Emphasis on establishing sound processes for effective fund management.

# 5. Collaboration with Advancement Department:

- Ongoing consultation to finalize processes.
- Updating terms of reference for specific funds as identified by the department.

# **14. Volunteer Report**

Presenter: Ryan Francis, Board Member, Chair, Volunteer Committee

# 1. National Volunteer Week 2024 (April 27 – May 3, 2024):

### • 2024 Activities:

- Focused on a social media campaign to highlight and thank volunteers.
- Plans for 2025:
  - Expand recognition efforts, including potential events aligned with Volunteer Canada's annual theme.

### 2. Refer a Student Program:

- Program Growth (2023-24):
  - Referrals increased from 30 to **237**.
  - Converted to **37 students** attending MtA in September 2024, generating an estimated **\$840,000 in tuition revenue**.

### • 2024 Goals:

 Focus on increasing the conversion rate from referrals to enrolled students.

# *3. Podcast Initiative:*

- Currently led by Carolle and a quadrant intern, leveraging the alumni network.
- The Volunteer Committee is working to expand the database of alumni participants for future episodes.

# 4. Volunteer Scorecard:

- Data Collection (2023-24):
  - Scott compiled data on 574 volunteers across various university departments.
- Key Findings:
  - Identified the need to streamline volunteer tracking and management.

### 5. Volunteer Management Plan:

- Current Efforts:
  - Streamlining volunteer tracking processes, confidentiality agreements, and program integration.
- 2024-25 Goals:
  - Develop a step-by-step plan for comprehensive volunteer management.

### 6. Mentorship Program:

- 2023-24 Outcomes:
  - Successfully paired **20 alumni mentors** with mentees, in collaboration with the First-Generation Office.

### • 2024-25 Updates:

- **22 pairings** completed.
- Focus on growing the mentor database in partnership with the Alumni Office.

### 7. Committee Membership Opportunities:

- There are two at-large member positions available.
- Virtual attendees are encouraged to consider joining to explore the committee and determine if it's a good fit.
