SUBMIT SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

WHAT DO I SUBMIT?*

Supporting documents are required to make an admission decision, so please submit your required documents as soon as possible in order for your application to be reviewed.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT

- **Early admission** (October – January) final Grade 11 transcript and Grade 12 course list (mid-year Grade 12 transcript required when available)
- **General admission** (February – September) mid-year Grade 12 transcript or final high school transcript if available

TRANSFER STUDENT

- Most up-to-date post-secondary transcripts for all institutions attended and final high school transcript
- More information on transfer credits at mta.ca/advancedstanding

* Required documents can vary based on your education, time of year you are applying, and if you are a mature student. Once you submit your application and \$50 application fee, you can view a full list of required documents in your online application account.

MATURE STUDENT

- If you're a mature student (22 or older at the beginning of the school year), you must also submit the following supporting documents with your application:
 - Letter of intent that outlines your personal and career goals and explains why you want to attend Mount Allison University
 - Updated resumé noting any relevant educational and professional experience
 - More information at mta.ca/maturestudent

WHERE DO I SUBMIT THE DOCUMENTS?

Upload all documents to your MtA application account at mta.ca/apply with the exception of your final official transcript, which must be sent directly from the issuing institution to Mount Allison by mail, fax, or e-mail.

ACCEPT YOUR OFFER OF ADMISSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS
