The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) is one of the largest employers in the federal government, employing approximately 44,000 people in all. You will work in an environment where people are committed to the values and principles of integrity, professionalism, respect and collaboration. CRA has offices in over 30 cities across Canada, and many career choices within our Agency will be accessible to you over the course of your career. If you aspire to take on challenges, are adaptable, work independently, have analytical skills and great interpersonal skills, then CRA is the place for you!

Key activities may include:

- Verify taxpayer returns, accounting records, claims and supporting documents to confirm and strengthen compliance with CRA administered legislation.
- Research law, jurisprudence, publications and policies.
- Discuss with taxpayers and / or their representatives about technical and litigious matters.
- Identify and collect data for use in referring observation questions to appropriate program areas.

Work hours are 37.5 hours a week (flexible schedule is a possibility). Rates of pay for Post-secondary School students begin at \$16.49 and can go up to \$21.77 per hour and are determined at the initial appointment or reappointment stage and are based on the student's current academic level.
