Work will take place in the Tantramar (Sackville & southeast NB) region.

Typical duties (and opportunities) may include:

- Assist with fish migration monitoring (including catching and tagging alewife, recording data, switching batteries, downloading data, antenna installation, etc.)
- Assist with eel passage monitoring (catching, counting, and measuring eels, installing eel traps and passage enhancement devices, recording data)
- Assist with wetland research at Beaubassin (e.g. invert sampling, water level/chemistry measurements, bird or plant surveys, etc.)
- Assist with waterfowl research (e.g. cavity nesting waterfowl project).
- Assist with wetland restoration program delivery (contour surveys, berm layout, site assessments, etc.)
- Assist with wetland management (project inspections, repairs, construction and installation of water control structures, etc.)
- Assist with waterfowl banding (setting traps, baiting, aging, sexing, identifying, and banding waterfowl) *

*funding dependent

A successful candidate should have:

- A strong interest and educational background in biology, environmental science, chemistry, or related field
- The ability to work in the field in any weather and condition, much of the work will be done outside
- A valid driver's license and reliable transportation would be an asset. The office is in Amherst NS, but work will be in Aulac (Beaubassin Research Station).
- Past related work experience would be considered an asset.
